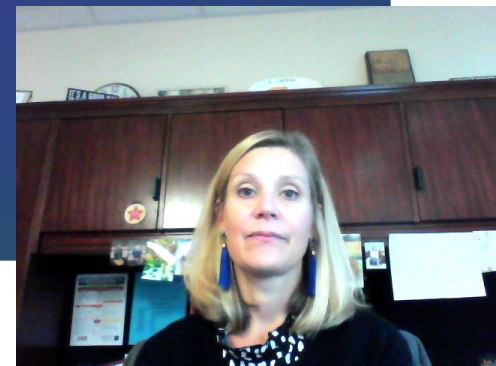

UGA/HOPE GPA

- Core classes only
 - All English
 - All Math

HOPE Scholarships

- **HOPE Scholarship**
 - GPA is based on all Core Classes including core academic electives
 - must be a 3.0 or higher (9-12)
 - Rigor requirement- must have 4
- Pays about 80% of tuition bill
- Zell Miller Scholarship (100% tuition)
 - 3.7 calculated Core, plus
 - 1200 CR/M SAT or 26/ACT composite in one sitting



HOPE GRANT

- **Best kept secret!**
- **No minimum GPA from high school**
- **Diploma or technical certificate of credit**
- **HOPE Career Grant in certain industries**

9th grade – Class schedules

- **For second semester**
 - Copy of course requests
 - Drop –add electives- End of October
 - Core classes – change of level- teacher recommendations –
waivers due Nov 15th
- **For the sophomore year**
 - Registration for classes – First of March
 - Freshman Advisement
 - Deadline for Waivers is May 1st- summer changes cannot
be accommodated



High school curriculum

- ▶ Students register for next year's courses in the Spring
- ▶ Current teachers make recommendations in regard to course placement/level of course
- ▶ Students/parents may waive up or down one level
- ▶ Reach for the maximum level of coursework that is APPROPRIATE (based on teacher recommendation, student ability and student motivation)- BALANCE
- ▶ Colleges ALWAYS favor higher level courses



Classes & Family Discussion

- During registration take the time to sit down with your child and discuss the classes recommended.
- A registration for coursework is a commitment to take the class. The master schedule is built based on student registration.
- Honors and Advanced Placement level courses place more emphasis on Critical Reading....which is measured in standardized testing such as the SAT



Ninth Grade Advisement

- ▶ In March, student with parent/guardian meet in small group
- ▶ Create a four year “road map” for required courses
- ▶ Recommendations for registration from Spring semester teachers based on class grades

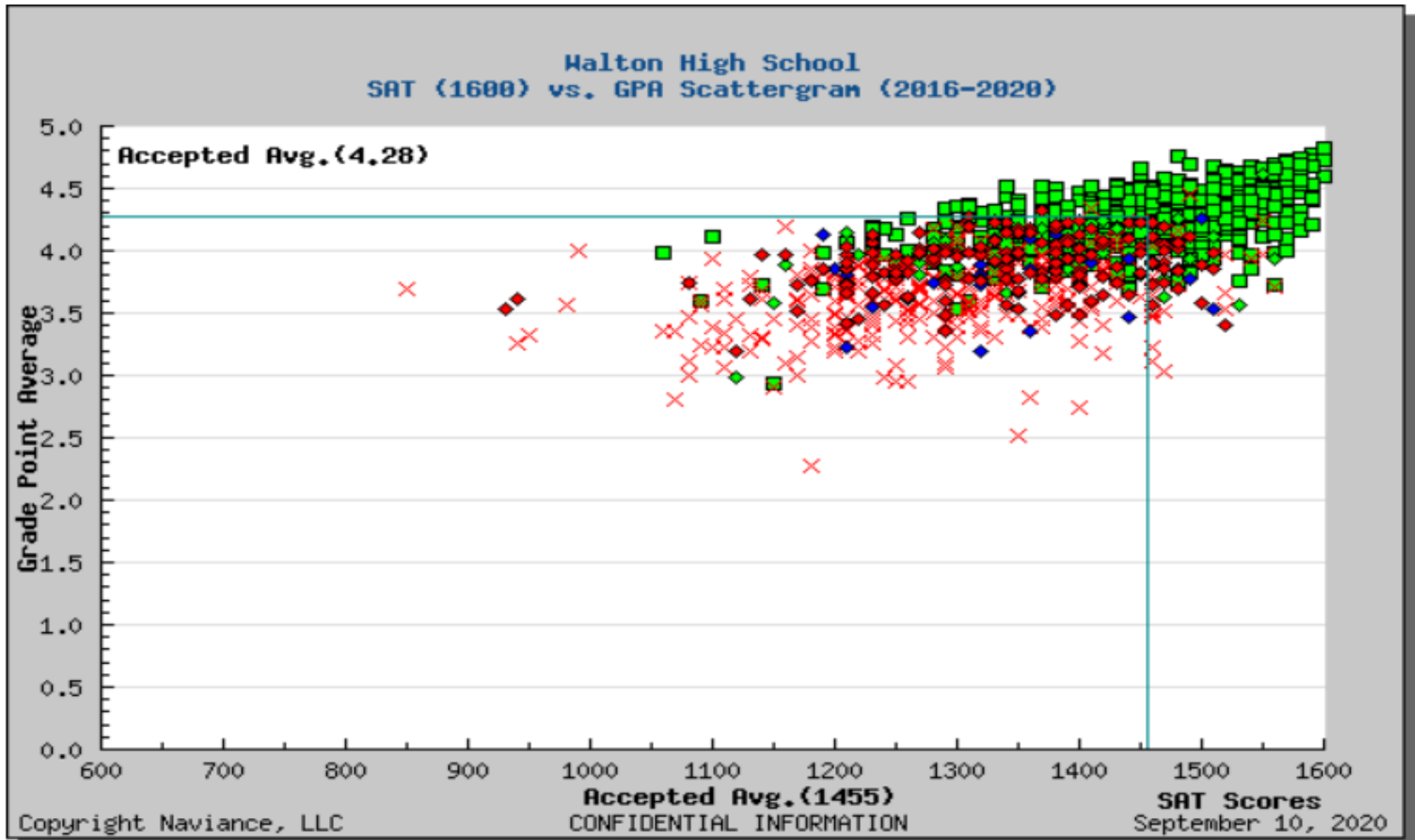


Overview of Naviance and Naviance Student

How to log into Naviance account:

Student access to Naviance

- ▶ If your student is using a CCSD computer, then he/she will automatically be logged into Naviance
- ▶ To log into Naviance from home, use the following:
- ▶ Microsoft 365 UserName
- ▶ Microsoft 365 Password
- ▶ Go to the Walton website (www.waltonhigh.org)
- ▶ Click on the baseball icon at the top right side of the Walton Home Page

Parent access to Naviance

- ▶ **Parents who have not previously set up a Naviance account:**
 - The enrolling parent received an email last week with information on how to set up a parent Naviance account.
 - To visit our school's Naviance Student site, use an Internet browser to connect to: <https://student.naviance.com/waltonhs>
 - When you visit the site for the first time, click the **"I'm new and need to register!"** link enter the personal registration code from the email and follow the on-screen instructions to create your own account.
- ▶ **Parents who did not receive an email or have a previously set up a Naviance account and have forgotten their username and password:**

2020-2021 Volunteer Service Recognition Program – Eligibility Requirements:

Students meeting the program requirements will receive a service honor cord to wear at graduation. Not all service hours can be counted for credit toward the graduation service cord. Service hours must meet the eligibility requirements listed below:

- ▶ **180 hours of verified and approved volunteer service** (accumulated by spring of senior year).
- ▶ **Service hours must be submitted in x2vol (online tracking system) in the school year in which they are performed.** Freshmen may submit hours from the first day of school, August 17, 2020. This year's deadline to submit service hours is May 14, 2021.
- ▶ **Service hours must be verified electronically through x2Vol by an adult** (not a parent or student). It is the student's responsibility to get their service hours verified.
- ▶ **Service hours must meet the guidelines for community service** outlined in the program description on the Dashboard (home page) of x2Vol and on the Walton website.

- ▶ **Submissions must include:**
 - ▶ The name of the individual or organization for which the student is volunteering (include a brief description of the organization if it is not clear by the name).
 - ▶ A brief summary of the type of service activities performed
 - ▶ The date or date range of the service activities. If submitting an activity performed over an extended period of time, include the date range of service activities and the number of service hours per day or week. Include this information in the Notes section.
 - ▶ The name and email address of the verifier. Include the verifier's personal or business email address. Do not use a club email for verification.

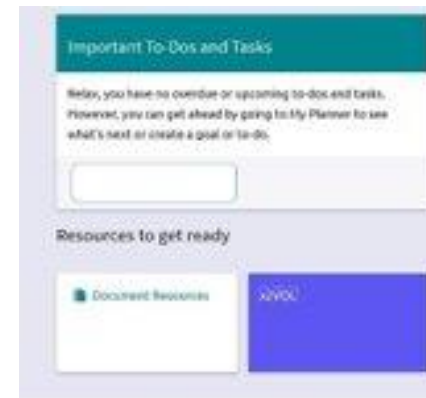
